


These ideal conditions await students fully aware of the **self-motivation, discipline and careful work** required for entering a career in high-end watchmaking.




Individualized training toward knowledge, skill and creativity

Students who succeed in intermediate and final exams are awarded **KHWCC's fullskill diploma**.




And more : specific workshops, lectures, collaborations, repairs...
